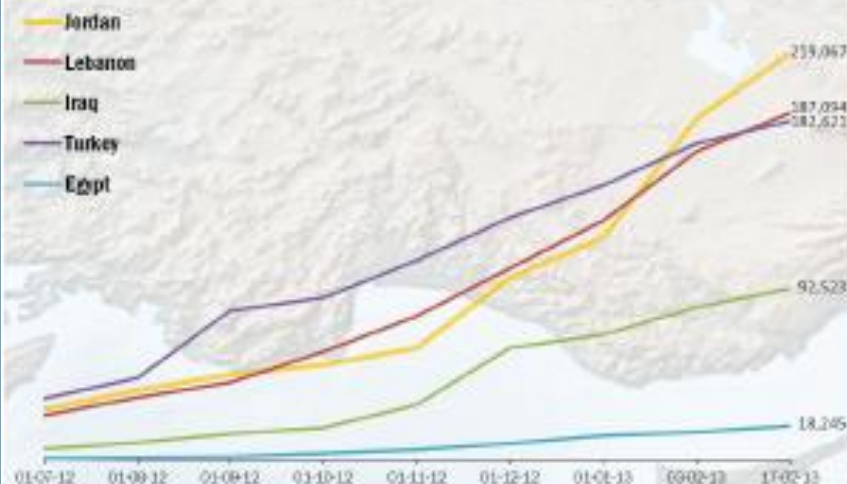

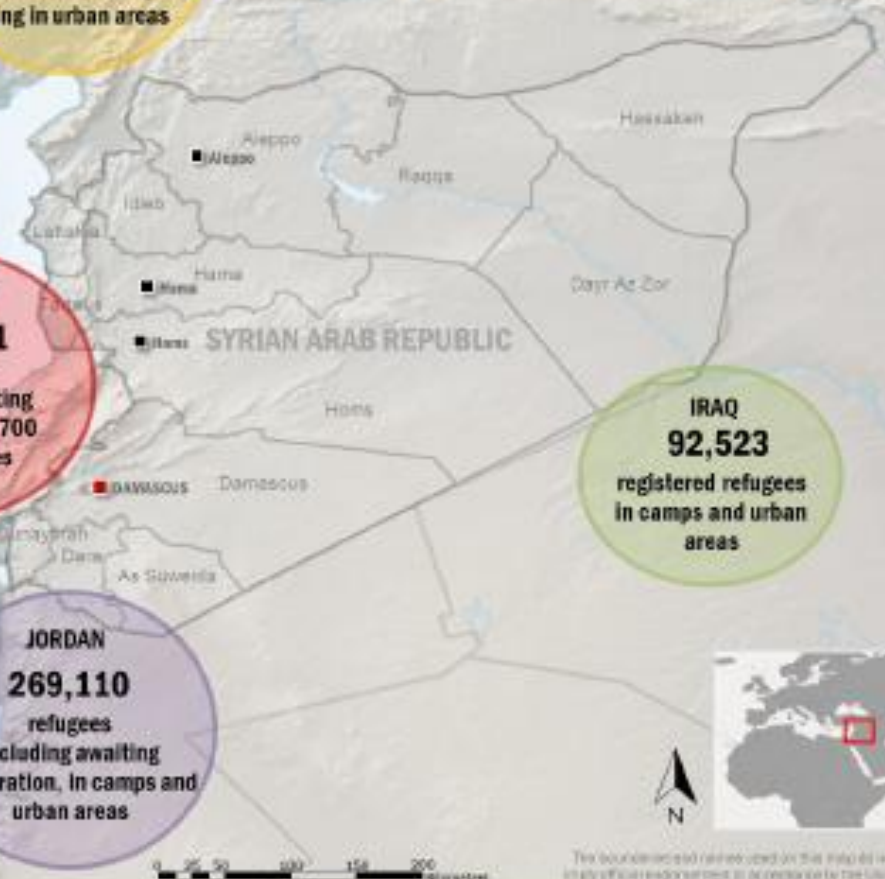

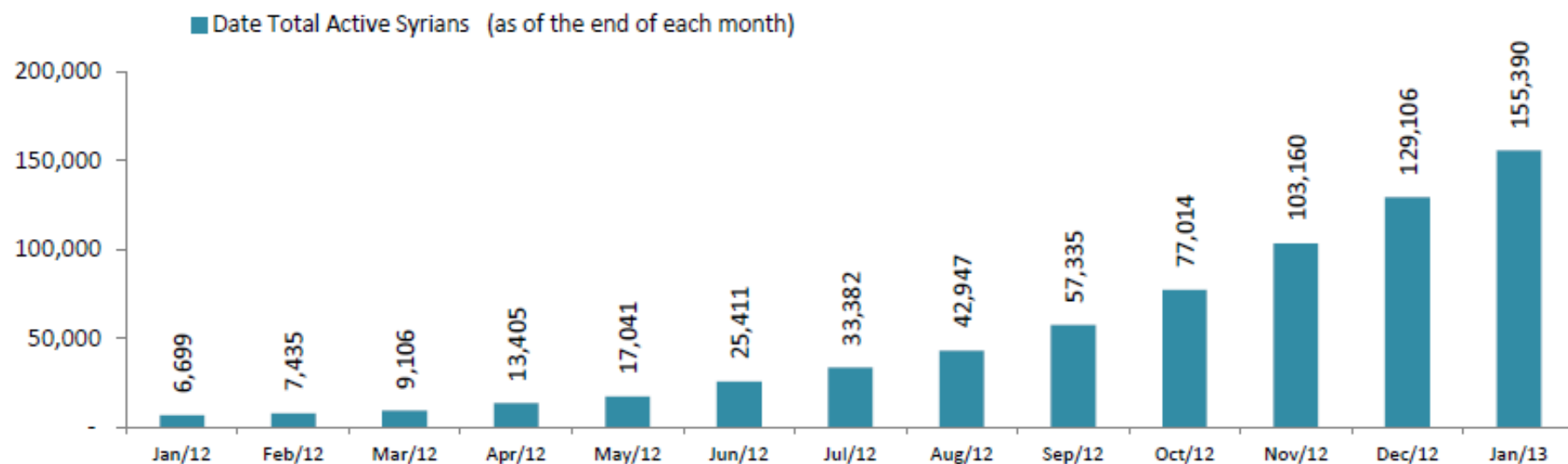

Distribution of Syrians in Lebanon

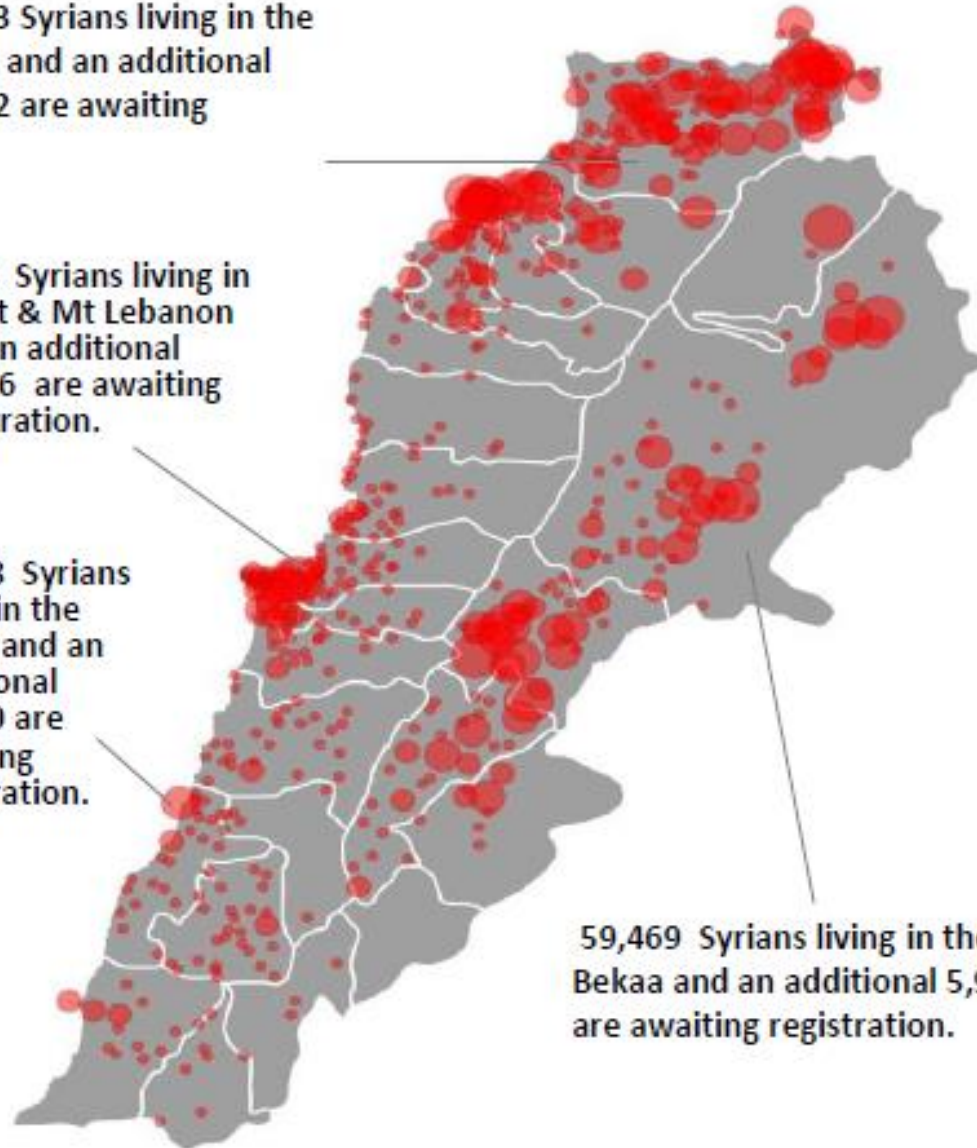
76,763 Syrians living in the South and an additional 14,872 are awaiting

Trends for 2013 ?

- Less resources / better weather → more and more tents
- Confessional and political aspects (acceptance by host population, Palestinian refugees, etc)
- What shelter solutions?
 - Helping refugees where they are Vs creating housing units?
 - Target few most vulnerable Vs aim at significant coverage?

Damascus and surroundings = over 5M persons,
30km from the border

→ Contingency :

- Preparedness through coordination, mappings, scaling up response capacity
- Identification (and preparation?) of “transition sites” and collective centres
- Stockpiling of shelter materials and NFI for Lebanon and Syria
