The first day will focus on learning from past experiences of shelter and settlement responses in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) by actively engaging actors using case studies from the <u>Shelter Projects publication</u>. Day 1 will also include an informal consultation to inform the development of an area/settlement-based approach guidance note, which will further support the rollout of the approach across the MENA region. In addition, the Arabic version of the online Shelter and Settlements Course will be released.

The second day is intended to be an open forum for exchange of ideas on shelter and settlement issues for practitioners in the MENA region and beyond. Building on the first day, the forum will review some of the best practices in the region, looking at how learnings can be transferred between countries, concentrating on a number of themes such as durable solutions and returns; engaging with local authorities; remote management and cash-based interventions.

The overall objective is to collectively review good practices and lessons learned, share experiences of approaches relevant to the MENA region, build or strengthen a community of practice and create networks in the region. The expected audience is humanitarian and development practitioners with regional / international experience in shelter, settlements, as well as other related sectors, local/regional institutions including academia, representatives from donors with a specific interest in shelter and settlements and/or the region.

The event will be hosted by the International Organization for Migration (IOM) and InterAction, in collaboration with global and regional partners and thanks to the support of USAID/OFDA.
