











Impact of conflict on buildings – 1/3 non-structural repairable damage






PCE and Self Recovery: a fictional case of Ms Amina in Aleppo





Result A: "What is the type and severity of damage to my home?"

Agreeing a global type and severity scale for non-structural damage



Example housing damage severity scale developed by IMG and used commonly in the responses to conflicts in the Balkans





Result B: "Is my home safe?"

- Development of a non-specialist selfrecovery tool for assessing safe entry to buildings damaged by conflict
- Similar assessment tool and training to those used by search and rescue teams following natural disasters

Result C: "What are the damages and costs to safely repair my home?"

Development of a non-specialist selfrecovery tool to assess nonstructural damage and the costs of repair






Result D: "How can I safely repair my home?"

Development of nonspecialist selfrecovery technical guidance on repairs and rehabilitation for non-structural damage



Timeline

Sectoral development 2004-2008

Uploading and monitoring of sectoral content

Confronted with the limits of and lack of comprehensiveness of the sectoral approach

Development in Beta

2013- 2018

Transition from mono- to inter-sectoral:

- One-click login through UN OCHA Humanitarian ID
- 1,000 documents, 100s agencies
- ❖ 100s of collaborators > crowdsourced
- Added user-curated spaces: channels and collections
- Connected to Global Sector fora Shelter Meetings
- Project collaborations with UNOPS and OFDA
- Regular contact with UN OCHA and some IASC Clusters (WASH, Shelter, CCCM, Protection) in discussing KM
- Exploring of Pakistan (through feedback results from context-specific survey) to develop localized knowledge
- Analytics on countries that accessed the HL
- Constructive feedback from selected users and corresponding adapted improvements

Current Development OCT, 2018- APR, 2019

- Support of unexplored activities (IOM's Women in Displacement, Shelter Cluster Working Group)
- Ongoing development of a proposal on the innovative area of Post-Conflict engineering
- More comprehensive knowledge management and structuring of Library services
- Supports localization activities
- Further uploading of resources
- Wider and larger range of registrants
- Increase of the HL's user-friendliness through a thorough User Guide and FAQs
- Development and early implementation of a Communications and Social Media Strategy

The inter-agency, inter-sector, crowdsourced and community-moderated Humanitarian Library is born, funded by USAID /OFDA

Re-Launching from Beta

OCT, 2018

After constructive feedback and corresponding development since 2013, the Humanitarian Library was launched from Beta in October 2018. This was achieved partly due to **project collaboration by UNOPS and OFDA**

Why?


How can the sector see **what** is going on within the sector?

Access and accountability: OCHA Humanitarian ID is open to all humanitarian stakeholders and is maintained by OCHA, therefore is a growing directory of the sector

VFM - minimal maintenance and moderation costs by crowd-sourcing

Initiating an online meeting/event/peer review:

- way of live videoconferencing (Skype for Business)
- way to post the event on the platform
- way to share news of this event with the sector

Building the sector: using stakeholder activity to create a sustainable dashboard

Post: the same things that are posted via social media - events, publication, job vacancies
