HOW it can be used

- To determine type of response, strengths and weaknesses of various approaches
- Relevant guidance

WHO can use it

- People moving into a new context, understanding specific shelter context
- Organizations learning to try new approaches

What's missing?

- Timelines
- Materials list
- Turkey - no details for add'l funds, approach and promote good technical practices
- To compare various standards from response

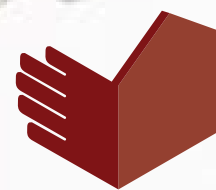
