





My shelter is near my work





My shelter is where I work



Women run 70-90% of HBEs (Gough, 2012)

At least 50% more women work in households with HBEs than those without

(Tipple et al., 2002)

My shelter affects my work

HBEs are "the single most important income source for the populations most affected by disaster"

(Sheppard and Hill, 2005)



20 days after super typhoon Haiyan in the Philippines in 2013 "a man finds time to cut his neighbour's hair" (Inquirer, 2013).




Just over a month after the earthquake and tsunami on Sulawesi, Indonesia in 2018. Fatnizar, a seamstress, used the awning of the emergency tent to recommence work. (ShelterBox, 2018).

What are the effects of HBEs on shelter?

- No humanitarian evidence
- Change from humanitarian to development
- Change from shelter and settlements to housing



- Include other search terms such as home-based work, business, employment, entrepreneur, microenterprises.
- Change from Home-Based Enterprises (HBEs) to Home-Based Work (HBW).



Method

Final search: Google Scholar search 2 April 2021



Findings

Locations

- Southeast Asia (21)
- Western Africa (11)
- Multi-country comparison studies (4)

Contexts

- Mostly development (all but 1)
- Humanitarian rural, grey literature examples mostly about recovery after the Indian Ocean Tsunami and excluded due to lack of information.

Gaps in Latin America and the Caribbean and in the Humanitarian sector.








Initial evidence from The Wider Impacts of Shelter and Settlement Assistance Report:

"Provides more than shelter – it is a place in which employment and home-based enterprises occur, providing direct income as well as income for those it employs"



Assets received (tools or physical space) can be used to re-establish, maintain or generate livelihoods

- Continued to use t-shelters as additional living space or business premises (van Dijk and van Leersum 2009)
- 10% used shelters for business purposes
 program extremely important in rebuilding livelihoods
 (TANGO International, 2007:21)
- Can be a platform for small business development (Sheppard and Hill, 2005:11)
- Shelter assistance allowed families to expand business (Shelter Project 2017/18: A8)
- Percentage destruction of dwellings is a proxy for percentage destruction of the means of livelihood (Martinez and Titiunik, n.d:17)
